



Supportive of the status quo, "an hereditary monarch, the sole executive power, an assembly of nobles, emanating from the crown, and a body of representatives, derived from the people by free and fair election, are each of them integral, vital and essential parts of our constitution, insomuch that the decay or corruption of any of them will taint or destroy the whole system", with a few minor reforms, ie. "declaring the right of election to be in every inhabitant housekeeper, paying taxes". Uncommon, with five locations on ESTC worldwide £40.00

Slightly later half roan and marbled paper over boards, smooth spine divided into

six panels by gilt double rules, title label to second panel, blind stamped quadrilobe to remaining panels. Rubbed and chipped to outer joints but holding well, extremities bumped and rubbed. Internally a little soiled and browned generally, K1 with old rudimentary repair to head and a small tear to fore-edge just catching text to K^{1v}. K⁴ with a small amount of loss to corner not affecting text, M8 defective with piece missing to foot losing the last line and a half of text and loss to imprint on M^{8v}, O⁵⁻⁸ chipped to fore-edge, O⁸ stained to text but not affecting sense. With the frontispiece. Bound from the fifteen eight page parts (the final part with nine pages). Hardie was one of the leaders of the 'Scottish Insurrection' of 1820, where a mixture of desperate times for weavers, the aftermath of Peterloo and the Cato Street conspiracy and with the 'help' of agents provocateurs, led to a proclamation of a provisional government, leading to a short-lived strike and civil unrest. Hardie, with Baird, was convicted of high treason and was hanged and beheaded (apparently the last beheading in the UK) in Stirling, with many other transported to Australia, See Berresford Ellis and Mac A'Ghobhainn, 'The Scottish Insurrection of 1820', Gollancz, 1970 £100.00



An important influence on Thomas Hardy, founder of the London Corresponding Society, it was reprinted by the LCS at least twice, indeed Thale in 'Selections From the Papers of the London Corresponding Society 1792-1799', notes that "this plan of annual parliaments and universal manhood suffrage ... became the bible for the LCS ... At Hardy's trial in 1794 this letter was read as evidence that the aims of the LCS had a reputable ancestry" £45.00





Waddington, "strongly espoused the cause of the republicans, and in 1795 was chairman of

several meetings in London held for the purpose of petitioning the crown and parliament to make peace with France. In consequence of his views he was expelled from the Surrey troop of light horse. In 1796 he attacked Edmund Burke in a pamphlet, Remarks on Mr Burke's Two Letters 'on the proposals for peace with the regicide Directory of France', censuring him for applying the term 'regicide' to the Directory" (ODNB) £35.00
