Good. 8pp, original paper covers, stitched as issued. Worn, slightly chipped to edges, slightly soiled, especially upper cover. A 'draft copy' of the rules of one of the first attempts at organising agricultural workers after Tolpuddle some forty years before. Local 'Agricultural Labourers Protection

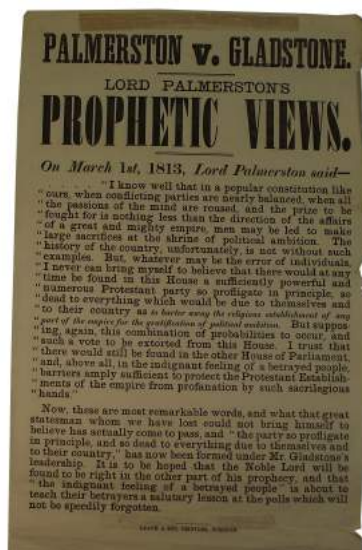
Associations' had been set up in the late 1860's, with Arch being the organising secretary of this Warwickshire one. They came together in 1872 under the banner of the 'National Agricultural Labourers' Union', which had over 100,000 members by the end of 1873. See David E. [04] [Anti-Gladstone Poster]. **Palmerston v. Gladstone - Lord Palmerston's Prophetic Views.** Wisbech: Leach and Son, First Edition. Elephant Folio. Unbound. Poster. Fair. Single sided printed poster, approximately 280mm x 440mm in size, n.d. c.1868? Chipped to edges with small amounts of loss, staining from tape to head and foot, a few small tears. The letterpress notes 'that great statesman [ie. Palmerston] whom we have lost', so presumably dates after Palmerston's death in 1865, and also mentions "the polls", so

perhaps dates from the General Election of 1868? BBTI notes a Leach as a printer in Wisbech from as early as 1823 and as late as 1847, so this could easily be the next generation of Leach's as the printer here [002068] **£30.00**

stealing bacon, the theft of a watch and maliciously maiming a horse amongst others. The printer was probably James Henry Marshall, who had a registered press in Aylesbury in 1810 (see BBTI) [002032] **£35.00**

Big Flame was a socialist group (1970-1984) largely based on Merseyside, but with other regional groups. The name was taken from a television play written by Jim Allen and directed by Ken Loach. Though quite a small group it produced a newspaper and a wide range of pamphlets and other ephemera [002078] **£40.00**

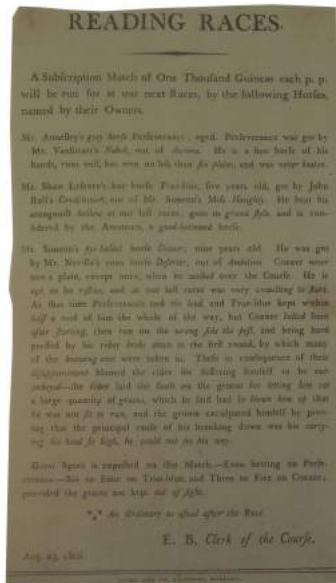

Wednesbury Cocking. No Place: No Publisher, Unknown. 4to. Unbound. Ballad. Fair. Printed, single-sided broadside ballad, approximately 190mm x 245mm in size, no publisher, no place, n.d. early nineteenth century? Browened, stained, small holes towards head and foot, creased. With woodcut of two cockerels to head. Wednesbury is a market town in England's West Midlands, with the

ballad mentioning many local towns (Walsall, West Bromwich, Bilston etc). Rather a bawdy affair! The closest match we could find in the Bodleian Ballad collection is Roud 23391, with the same text, but with the woodcuts closer together and no lines between the columns. Seemingly unrecorded in this state [002035] **£50.00**

Election squib for the Reading election of 1806 taking the form of a horse race, mentioning Francis Annesley, 'Perseverance', MP for Reading from 1774; Charles Shaw Lefevre, 'True-Blue', who represented Reading

from 1802-1820 and John Simeon, 'Coaxer' [002066] **£75.00**



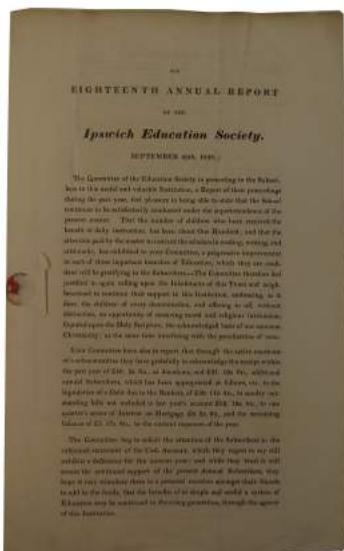

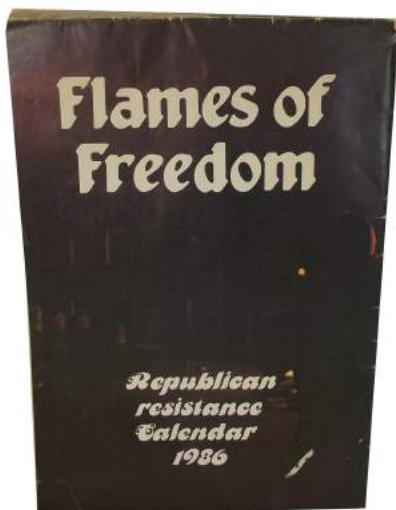

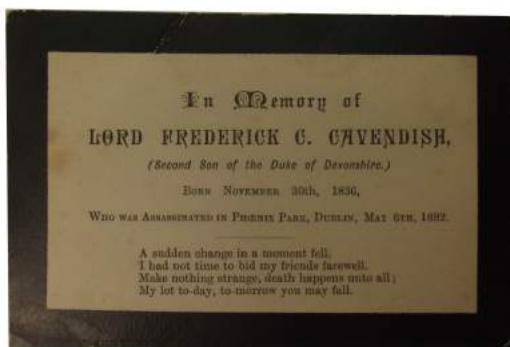

William Brown, who is mentioned in the list of subscribers for the next year, donating 10s 6d. Brown was earlier involved in the Suffolk Society for the Education of the Poor in the Principles of the Established Church [002038] **£30.00**

Cavendish had recently been appointed as Chief Secretary for Ireland and Burke (the real target, and also murdered) was the Permanent Under Secretary, the most senior civil servant in Ireland [002069] **£50.00**

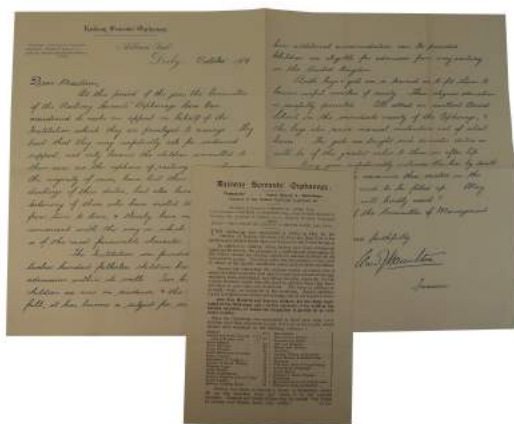

the Lancashire and Cheshire Miners' Permanent Relief Society for April 1879 (12pp) and a folding chart showing the number of members in 1878 (probably removed from a pamphlet or book). All three items are rubbed and a little creased and soiled, the Rules has a ?name in ink across the head of the upper cover, with slight loss to paper on the lower cover where removed from an album, the Report has two ink spots to upper cover and sewing cuts to gutter edge where removed from a bound volume. 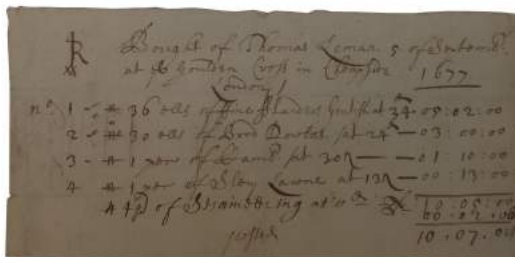

The Orphanage was established in Derby in 1875 for the children of Railway Servants (workers) who lost their lives in the performance of their duties, or with a small annual subscription by the father, his children were also eligible if he died from natural causes [002040] **£15.00**

A puzzle paper, probably based on the well known handkerchief, which

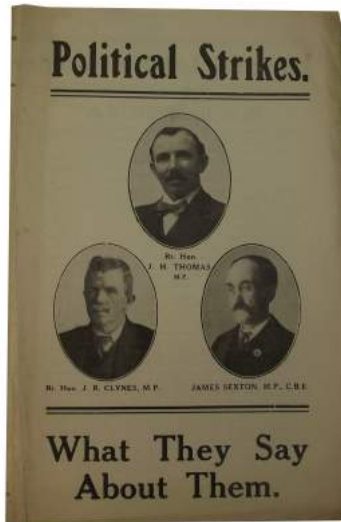
once folded correctly becomes a picture of Disraeli, the handkerchief features Prince Gorschakoff, Otto von Bismarck, Safvet Pacha and Andrassy, but on the paper one offered here the national characters appear to be a little more generic, or perhaps the artist wasn't quite as talented. We think we have worked it out, but again the Disraeli character isn't instantly recognisable, but of course we may have it incorrectly folded! [002064] **£95.00**



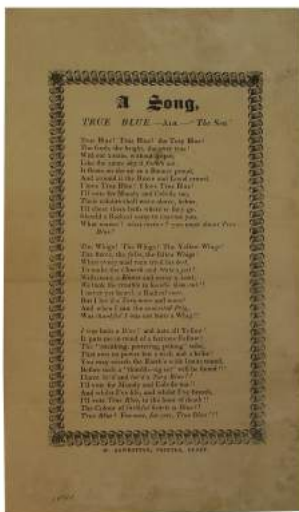

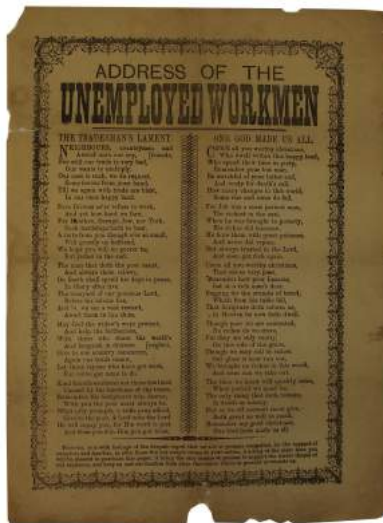
including 'Fine Flanders Gentish', with what appears to be a hand drawn illustration of the drapers sign to the top left hand corner, the signs are often found engraved on later eighteenth century receipts, but this is the first time I've seen one drawn [002037] **£85.00**

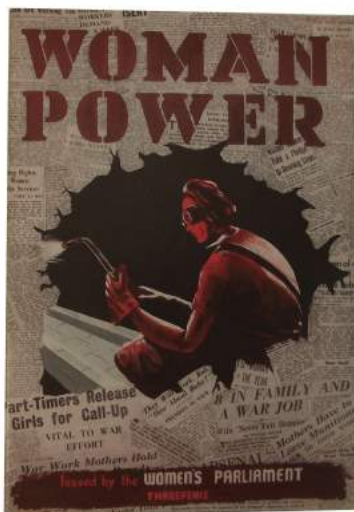

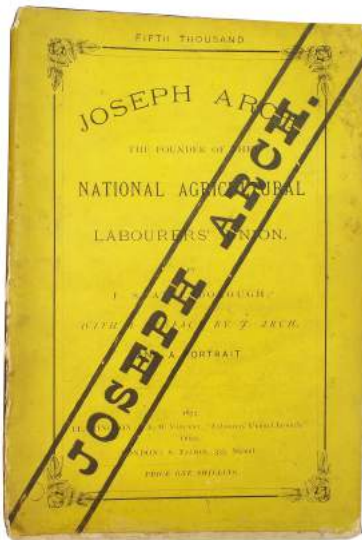

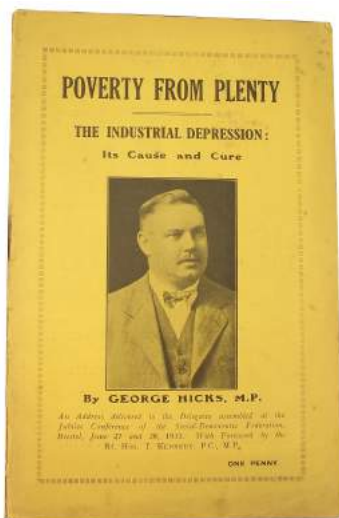

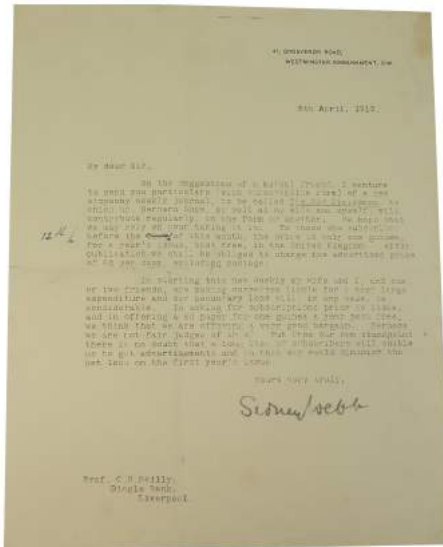
