Externally very good indeed, internally browned with patches of foxing throughout, light staining to foot, first and last pages completely silked, a few corners and margins throughout have also been silked, a few corners missing (not affecting text), but generally the paper is intact. One or two are bound out of sequence. The issues of the English Chartist Circular are (Volume One) No. 25, and (Volume Two) No's 77, 79, 81-84 and 87; The Chartist Circular - (1839), no. 1, 3-8, 14, (1840) 16-44, 56, 57, 64-66, (1841) 70, 75, 76 and 84. There is a list in an old hand of the executed, respited and acquitted in pen to the reverse of the title and two pages of notes about the trial in pen tipped in to the rear (dated 1847). The Supplement is continuously registered and paginated. Despard was found guilty, hanged and then decapitated (with six others). The prosecuting Attorney General was Spencer Perceval, later Prime Minister, who was assassinated by John Bellingham in 1812, the only Prime Minister to be assassinated whilst in office. One of several versions of Despard's trial, this one is uncommon, COPAC showing at Oxford only **£150.00**



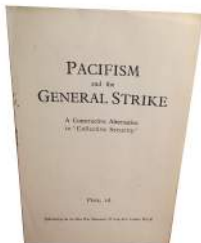

Lacking initial blank. "This reply to Barron's 'History of the Colonization of the Free States of Antiquity' was credited to Meredith in John Almon's 'Biographical, Literary and Political Anecdotes', where he says 'It was never published to the world; he printed only thirty copies which he gave away'. The fifteen letters are dated from 30 Apr. 1778 to 14 Oct. 1778" (Adams). This is the variant with a quotation from Thucydides on the title page, Adams noting that "Although this was printed from substantially the same setting of type, there are a number of textual revisions, notably on pp. 13 and 82.
