Arthur Wragg 1903-1976

Wragg, was a "cartoonist, illustrator, teacher, and Christian pacifist ... His work was shaped by the momentous events that dominated British life from the 1920s to the 1960s" (Brook, *Arthur Wragg - 20th Century Artist, Prophet, and Jester*, page iv). Much of the information in this catalogue is from Brook's book


Horne notes that he is best known for the "powerful, strongly contrasting black and white drawings he made for books published by Selwyn and Blount. His social, political, and spiritual concerns for the poor in Britain, their living and working conditions in the 1930s, and the threat of war, are starkly realised in these intensely-felt illustrations" (Horne, *The Dictionary of 20th Century British Book Illustrators*, page 451)

The majority of this catalogue was bought at the recent sale of the archive of both Wragg's and Roberts Johnson's artwork in Cornwall, not very far from Polperro where they lived together for some time, the works being consigned by the family of Roberts Johnson. A few of the books are from elsewhere, including a couple from my own collection

Two letters from Wade to Wragg, the first dated 14th August 1942, relating to the difficulty in acquiring colour paint, with a suggestion from Wade that Wragg looks up "some old books on artists colour mixing ??? you might find some way of using them". The second letter, dated September 7th 1942, shows Wade telling Wragg about the chemical make up of a sample of paint, and again relates to Wragg's difficulty in the supply of dry powder colours, noting that the colours are of poor quality anyway. and that the shortage is more due to the shortage of the binding agent dextrine, going on to suggest the use of ordinary size instead, with instructions of how to mix the various elements. Though perhaps insignificant against the wider backdrop of war, it is an interesting example of the often overlooked quotidian matters for artists, and others, on the home front [004753] £25.00






